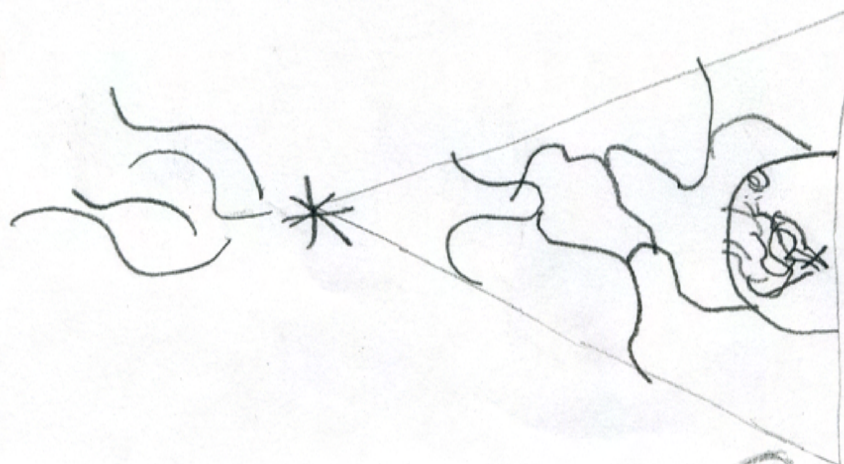
One day the penobscot people noticed

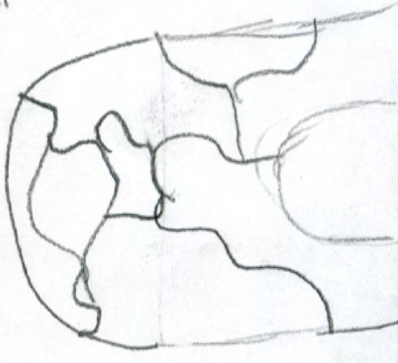

Conical shaped wigwam

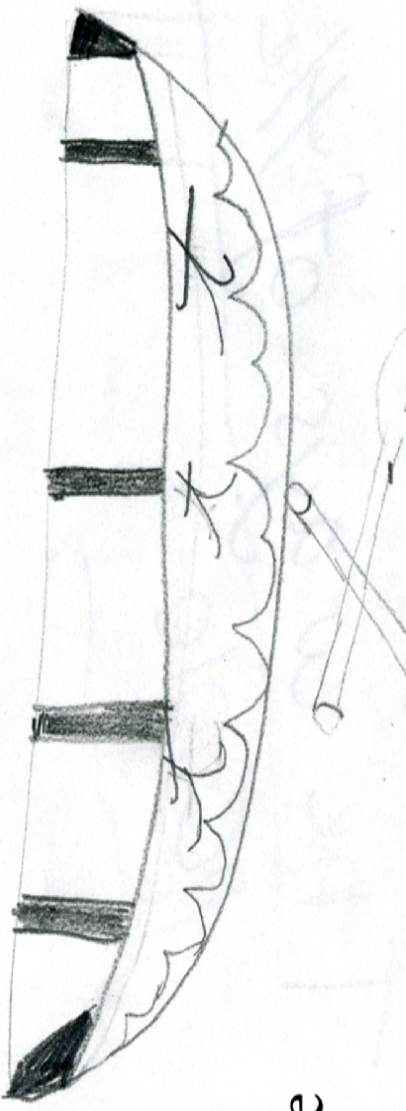


Regular wigwam



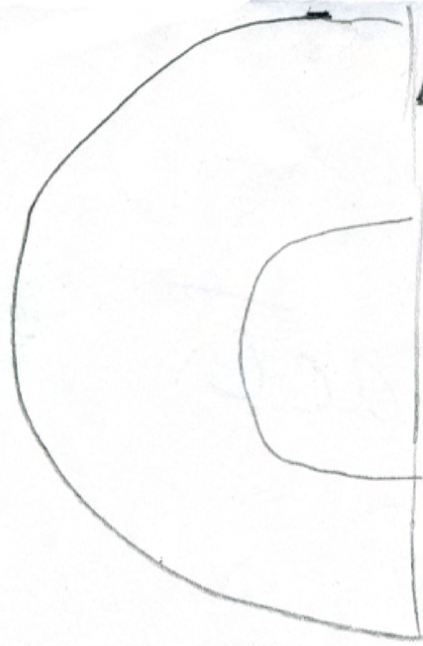
Village Life

The Penobscots settled on Marsh Island because of the river ~~Penobscot~~ brought animals. The Indians needed food so they ate fish, plants and deer/moose/musk. The Penobscots used to live every where in Maine. Canoes were the best traveling source because the forest has so many bushes that you would have to walk around. Kahtahdin was known for the middle of the world to the Penobscots because Mt. Kahtahdin is in the middle of the watershed. Most rivers went into the Penobscot river then, the Penobscot river dumped into the ocean. The Penobscots summer home was near the ocean. They would eat mussels and crabs when they would throw the shells into piles. The shells preserved and now you can still see where Indians threw their shells it's kind of like a fossil. The Penobscots caught sturgeons (a type of fish) by lighting a torch the sturgeon would be curious and would come to the top of the water then the Penobscots would stab the sturgeon. Fiddle heads were a good source of food. If you don't eat them they'll turn into ferns. Do you know what the three sisters are? Well, if you don't I'll tell you right now. The three sisters are corn, beans, squash. If you plant them together this is what will happen: the beans grow up the corn stalks the squash provides leaves, and nitrogen for the beans so they all work together that's why they are called the 3 sisters. Indians lived in wigwams made out of bark, leaves, twigs and mud. A tipi is a conical shaped wigwam. Penobscots would make baskets out of ash trees they would pound an ash log until it breaks into strips then with those stripes you weave a basket.

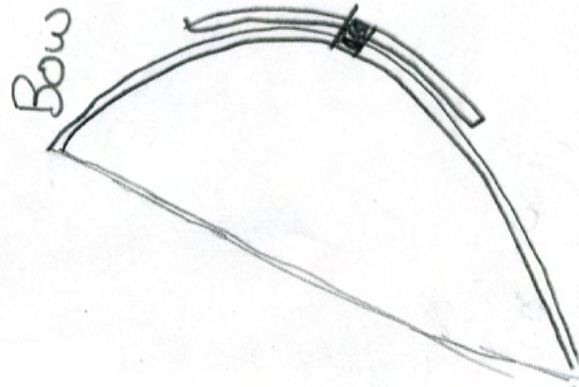
When Europeans first came to America, Indians first noticed their beards. Indians didn't have beards at the time. Europeans needed axes and other resources from the Indians. In the year 1600, Weymouth kidnapped 5 Indians so he could communicate with them once they know how to speak. English Weymouth could trade metal items for furs with the Indians. Europeans brought diseases from being in dirty cities which caused 75% of Indians to die because the disease the Europeans brought.

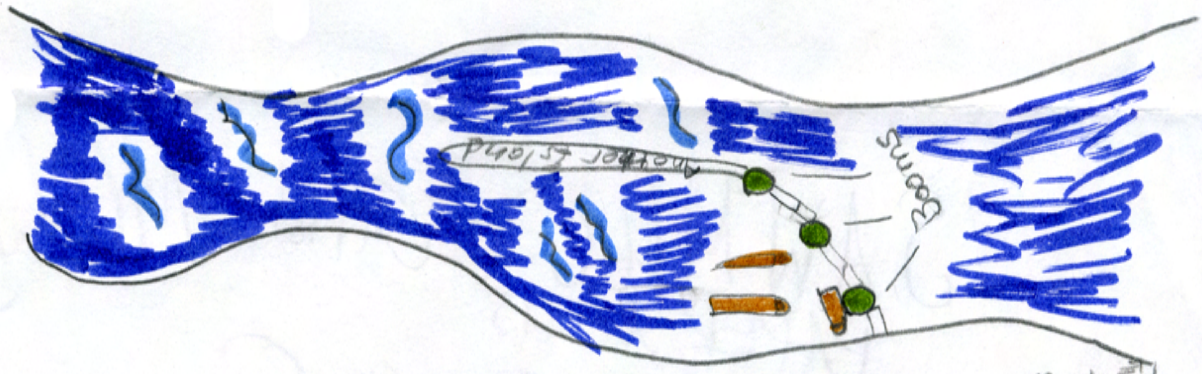

Industrial Revolution

Lumber mills are run by water power and when the chemicals they don't need gets dumped into the water. The first elected chief was Joe Attean. Born on Dec. 25th died on July 4th he was going to unjam some logs. (the logs were a way to move lumber over the river because their wasn't big trucks that could do it in the river)

The logs got unjammed but Joe Attean's boat flipped over and he drowned underneath all those logs. (Joe Attean drowned because he couldn't push a log from above him so he could get air.) The Millinocket paper mill was built about 100 yrs. ago. The Millinocket town was built around the Paper mill so could support the paper mill. A boom is (see picture) a man made island that is made for logs to stop flowing down the river make these little island and tie logs in between each one so that logs don't slip by.

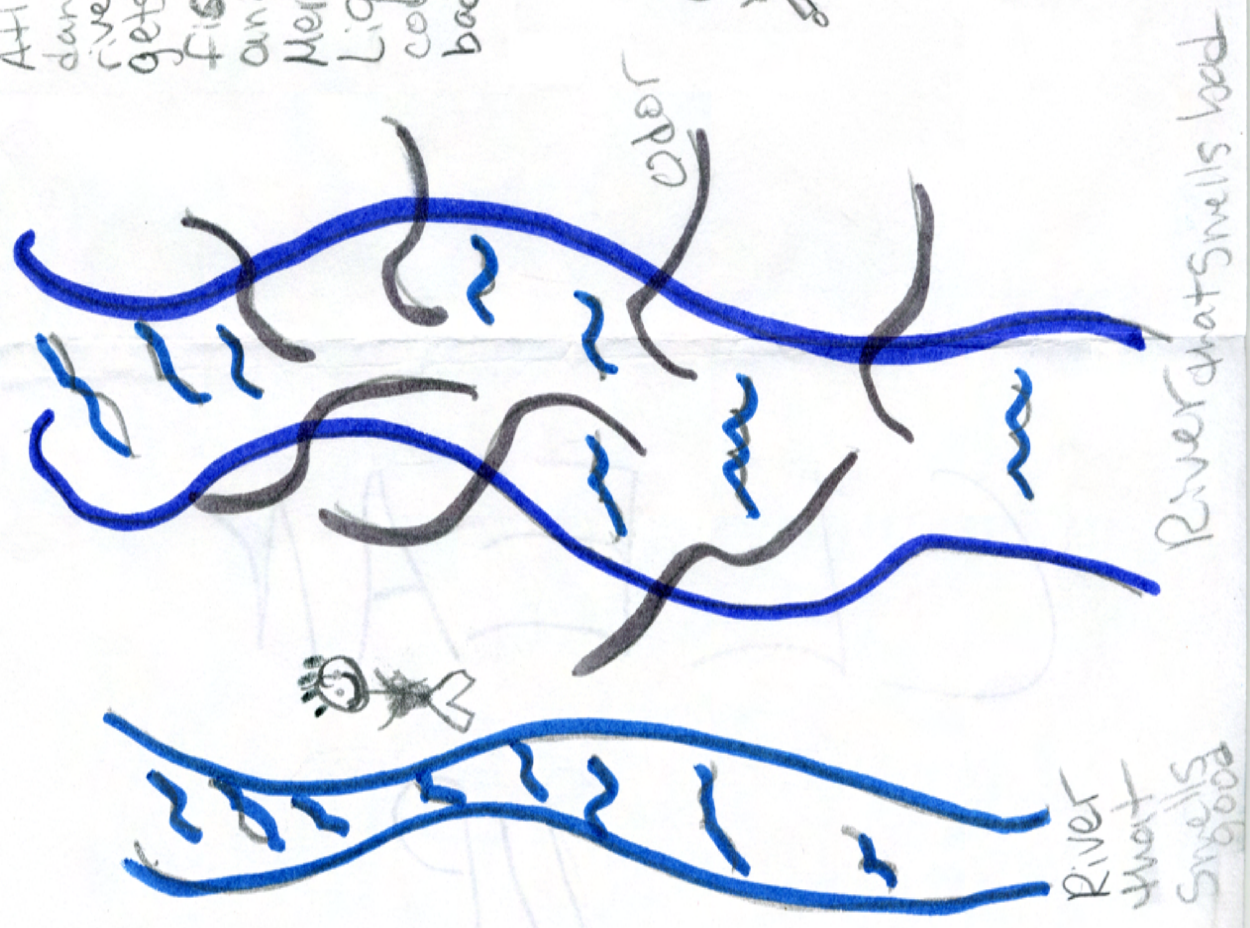


Rail track / Road track



Sometimes they have trains that take the logs to the sawmill. Or the sawmill is right next to the boom.

People start dumping waste in the river, sawdust and bad chemicals are being dumped into the river too. 7 organizations are trying to help this cause today they are: Penobscot Nation, Trout Unlimited, Natural Resources Council of Maine, Maine Audubon Atlantic Salmon Foundation, American Rivers. Extremely dangerous chemicals are being dumped into the river. Dioxin is one it can cause cancer. Dioxin gets into fishes body and gets stored away in the fishes body. When people catch these fish and eat them that poison gets into peoples body. Mercury is another type of chemical, it's called Liquid Metal. In the 50's and 60's people couldn't walk by the river without it smelling bad!
